Eckersley House opened in 1993 and supports families with sick children receiving treatment at St James' Hospital in Leeds. Since opening, Eckersley House has helped approximately 800 families every year.



Situated within the hospital grounds on Beckett Street, Eckersley House is only minutes away from St James' Hospital and has been specially designed to ensure access for those with disabilities.



Eckersley House has 15 private family bedrooms and a self contained flat, 4 bathrooms, a fully equipped kitchen, a large communal dining area, a well stocked playroom, a shared living room and full laundry facilities.



There are also direct telephone lines in all of the family bedrooms linking them to the hospital wards so that families can be contacted immediately in the event of an emergency.



Eckersley House is open 365 days a year and can accommodate 16 families a night. Rooms are allocated to families on a first come, first served basis and are offered to families completely free of charge.



We are funded solely by voluntary donations from individuals, companies and charitable trusts to provide the valuable service that we offer for sick children and their families throughout the UK. The cost of staffing and maintaining Eckersley House amounts to £60,000 a year.

Our 'Home from Home'

All of our houses vary in size and layout, but families staying in each of our 'Homes from Home' will have:

House Managers for families to turn to when they need someone to talk to or a shoulder to cry on. They are at the heart of our work; responsible for the smooth running of the house and ensuring that parents needs are met so that they can spend more time with their children.

Facilities for brothers and sisters such as play areas with plenty of toys, books and games, televisions and video recorders to help children feel more at home.

Short distances to the children's wards that enable sick children to spend time with their families in the 'Home from Home' when they are well enough.

Direct telephone lines to the wards in all bedrooms so that parents have peace of mind, knowing that they are only a phone call away from their sick child's bedside.

Private bedrooms where it is safe to leave personal possessions.

Fully equipped kitchens to enable families to enjoy home cooked meals together, an important component of family life.
