

ACORN HOUSE AT ADDENBROOKE'S HOSPITAL

Acorn House, built by The Sick Children's Trust, was opened in 2000 to provide quality, homely accommodation, free of charge, for parents and siblings to use whilst a child is in hospital. The house was extended in 2006 to meet demand; it now helps about 750 families each year and is open 365 days of the year.

Thanks to all our supporters and helpers, over 3000 families have benefited from the facilities provided. The Cambridge Fundraising Committee has now raised more than £250,000 towards the running costs. All the money raised from donations, raffles and events goes directly to Acorn House.

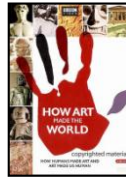
