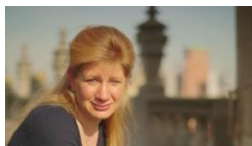

A LIFE OF CHARLES II

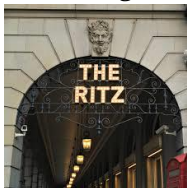
