Thursday 31 January: 'DR JOHNSON AND HIS LOVE OF BOOKS'

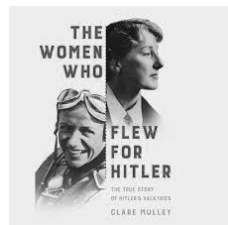
